Educational Quality and Effectiveness

The purpose of GBTS is to train the next generation of pastors, church planters, and missionaries with a commitment to confessional Baptist doctrine, academic rigor, and a passion for the local Church. GBTS graduates are consistently on the front lines of ministry.

GBTS Faculty

- 88% of GBTS faculty members currently serve or have recently served in pastoral ministry.
- 9 regular faculty members, including 7 who currently hold Doctoral degrees.
- Faculty-to-student ratio is 1:5.5
- 100% of faculty members teach live courses to facilitate interaction with students

Program Design and Delivery

- 100% of regular GBTS courses taught in the 2022-2023 academic year featured live lecture and direct faculty-student interaction.
- 3 on-campus intensives offered during the 2022-2023 academic year.
- Residential and distance students alike have the opportunity to interact with professors and peers in a live, synchronous course format.

Course Evaluations

- 100% of students at GBTS reported that their classes helped them prepare for the tasks of preaching, counseling, and/or teaching in the local Church.
- 99% of course evaluations reported that the course met or exceeded the student's learning expectations.
- 92% of course evaluations reported that the course lectures were very or exceptionally interesting and engaging.

Graduate Statistics

- 100% of GBTS graduates in the last 3 years are actively involved in local church ministry.
- 50% of GBTS graduates in the last 3 years are serving in full-time vocational ministry.
- 100% of GBTS M.Div. graduates in the last 3 years completed their degree in under four years.
